Five Illusions that Lead to an Affair: (Proverbs 7)

Illusion #1:

That which seems harmless is actually dangerous.

- What seems harmless? -- Flirting, gazing, sharing.
- Reality: You fell in love because you dated each other.

Illusion #2:

That which seems perfect is deeply flawed.

- What seems perfect? -- The other men or woman, of course.
- Reality: Marriage is the school of character

Illusion #3:

That which excites you actually deadens you.

- What excites you? -- Your fantasies.
- Reality: Sex is the "mirror" of your relationship

Illusion #4:

That which seems to justify your actions actually condemns you.

- What seems to justify your actions? -- A laundry list of rationalizations.
- Reality: You have to work to stay connected

Illusion #5: That which seems easy is hard.

- What seems easy? -- Quitting.
- Reality: None of us have arrived in marriage.
